# JIM FAILED TO PROTECT GIRLS

In 2020, Woodward joined 22 Democrats and voted **AGAINST** House Bill 500. He failed to protect girls from transgenders in girls' sports.

# JIM FAILED TO PROTECT THE BORDER

Woodward stated that he supports 2023's SJM101 which contained amnesty for illegal immigrants.

Woodward also voted for SCR107 to begin the process of driver's licenses to illegal aliens.

# JIM FAILED TO PROTECT CHILDREN

Jim helped kill H249 in 2021. H249 required parental opt-in before children were taught eroticism and sexual pleasure and passed the House 56-12.

Woodward supported S1193, a \$6 million grant to a group that recommended books that teach gender dysphoria and confusion. It passed the Senate by 1 vote (Democrats in favor) and was killed in the House.



# SCOTT HERNDON PROTECTED GIRLS

Herndon co-sponsored Senate Bill 1100 in 2023 that protected girls from boys in girls' bathrooms at our public schools. S1100 passed and was signed into law.

# SCOTT HERNDON PROTECTED THE BORDER

Scott Herndon **opposed** SJM 101 on the Senate floor because it contained amnesty for illegals.

Herndon sponsored HJM8 calling for the impeachment of Joe Biden for failing to secure the southern border

# SCOTT HERNDON PROTECTED OUR CHILDREN

Scott Herndon helped write and pass H498 into law. H498 requires age verification by online pornography peddlers and prohibits porn being provided to children.

Herndon also supported H71 which criminalizes transgender surgeries and medical treatment on children. Herndon wrote H668, which blocks taxpayer funding for transgender surgeries.

# LIBERAL JIM FAILED TAXPAYERS

In 4 years, Jim **never voted against a spending bill**. During that time, Idaho state spending grew 43% from \$9.0 billion to \$12.9 billion. Jim approved \$5

# JIM EXPANDED THE WELFARE STATE

Woodward supported S1098 with the Democrats in 2021. S1098 required insurance companies to provide 12 months of birth control. S1098 was defeated on the Senate floor by conservative Republicans.

Jim joined the Democrats and **opposed work requirements for Medicaid**. Conservative Republicans passed into law S1204 in 2019.

# JIM FAILED ON HEALTH FREEDOM & EMERGENCIES

Jim **opposed** S1381 in 2022. S1381 would have protected Idahoans from mandatory Covid jabs. Over 80% of the Republicans voted in favor, but **not** Jim Woodward.

On H135, Jim voted with the 22 Democrats against the right to work during Covid when 77 Republicans stood up for the right to work



# SCOTT HERNDON ACHIEVED SPENDING REFORMS

Herndon opposed some of the bloated budgets in 2023. That helped cause the legislature to adopt line-item budget reforms in 2024 and hold total spending flat.

# SCOTT HERNDON OPPOSED WELFARE EXPANSION

Herndon opposed another attempt by the Democrats to require 6 months of birth control by private insurance companies to all policyholders. The bill was S1234 in 2024.

Scott Herndon **trimmed** \$160 million from Idaho's Medicaid budget in 2023 due to ineligible recipients and supported stronger requirements to receive unemployment.

# HERNDON STOOD FOR HEALTH/RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Scott Herndon proudly supported S1130 in 2023 to ban mandatory Covid jabs. It passed with every Senate Republican supporting it and is now law.

When Idaho's governor criminalized church during the pandemic, Scott Herndon sued in federal court, and the governor backed down
